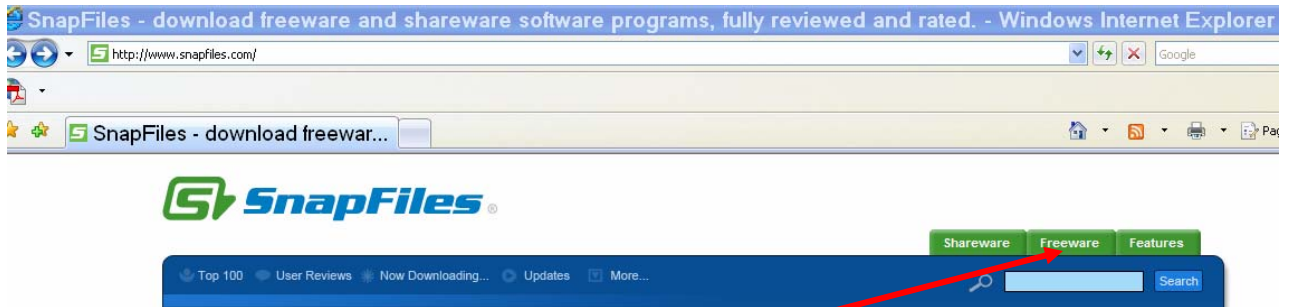
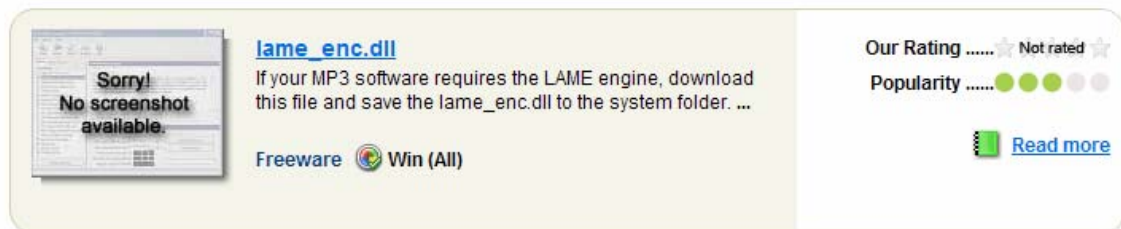


How to download the Lame Encoder for Audacity:

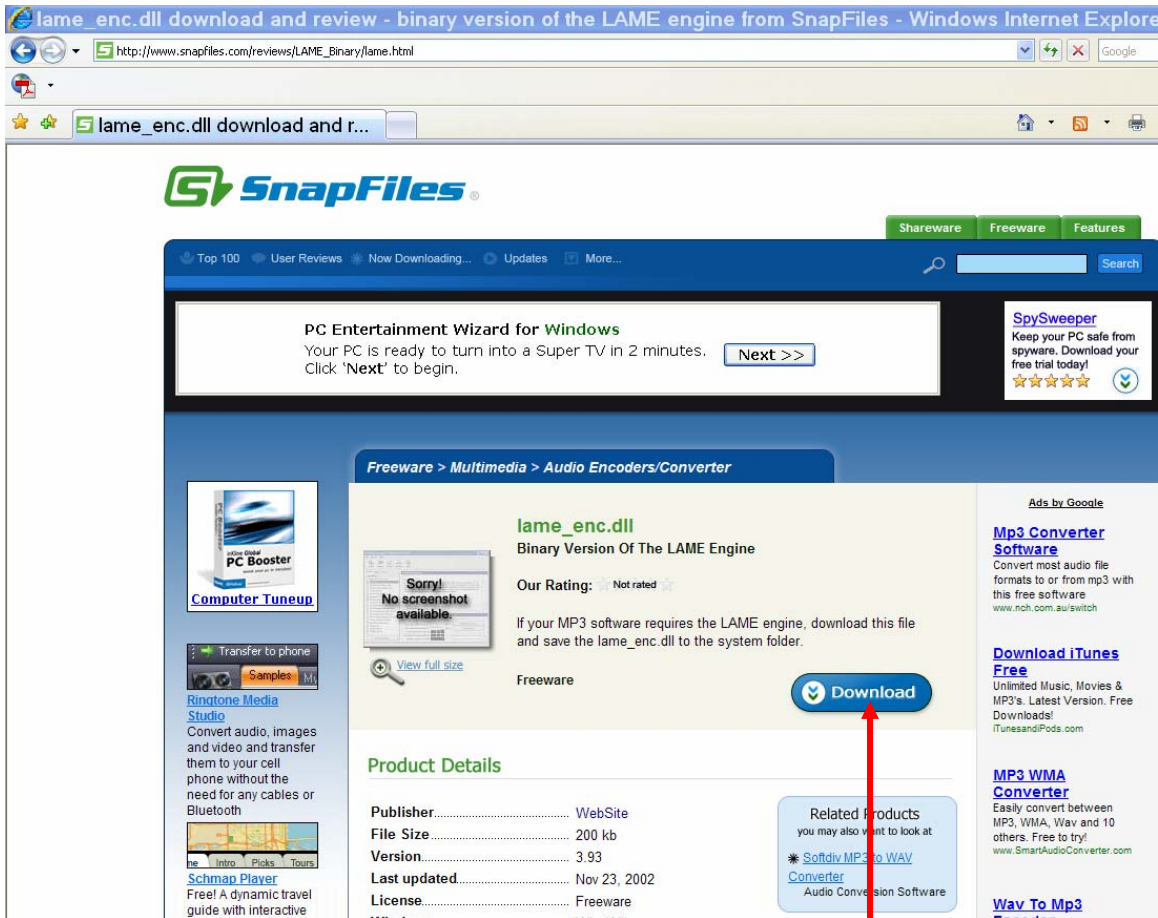
- 1) Go to the website www.snapfiles.com



- 2) Click on the “Freeware” tab.
- 3) In the search area, just under the “Freeware” tab, type in “Lame Encoder” and click search.

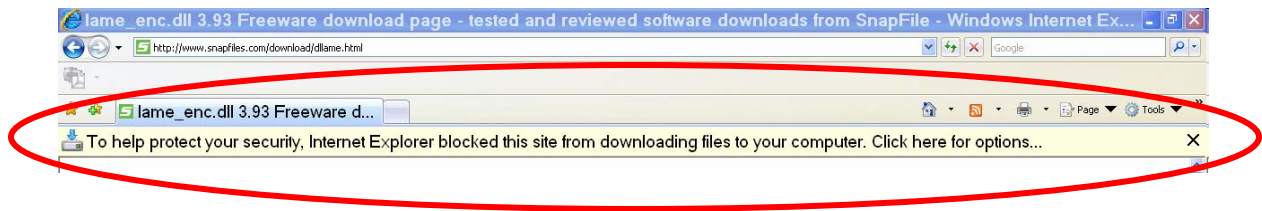


- 4) Look for this software link. Click on the blue “lame_end.dll” and you will go to another webpage that looks like this.



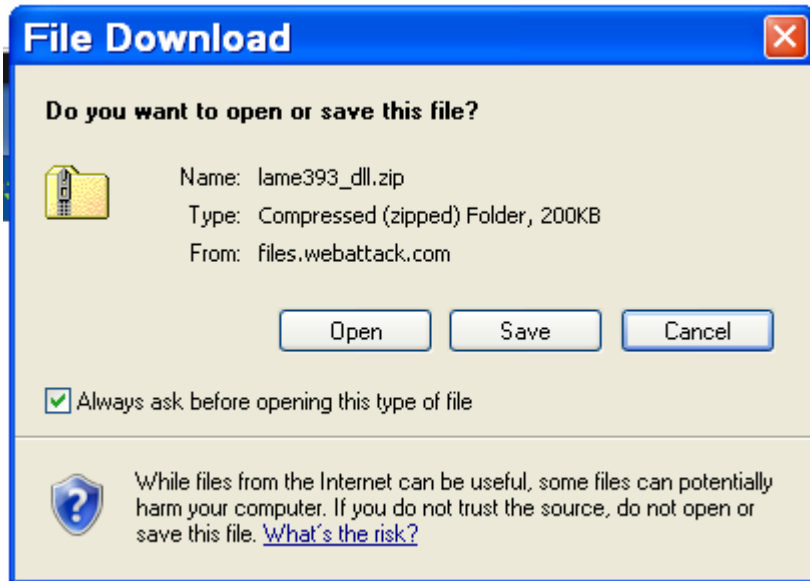
5) You will want to click on the blue “download” button.

6) If your computer is like mine and has service pack 2, your popup blocker will stop your download. Just click on the tan popup blocker bar and select “download file.”



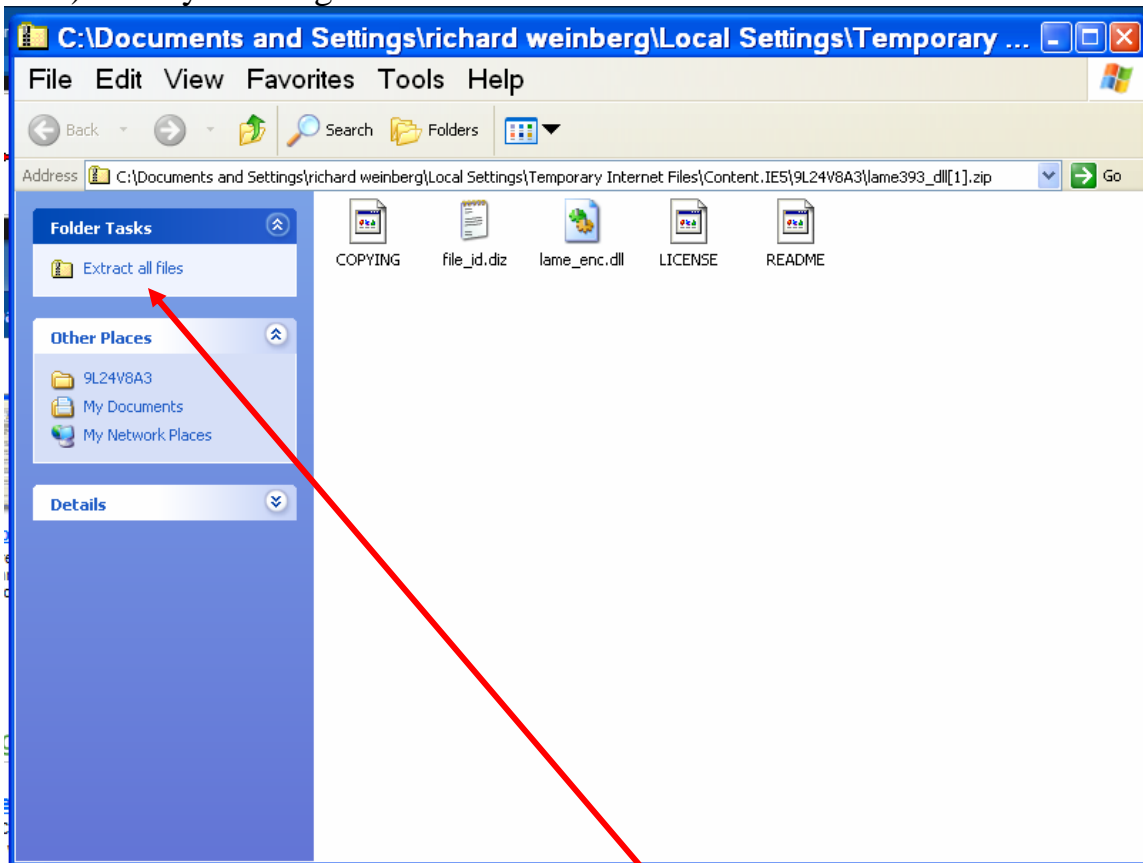
Above I have circled what the tan popup blocker bar looks like. After you click on the tan popup blocker bar and select “Download File” you will get an open or save download box. These will be Zipped files, which just mean they are compressed.

You will get a box that look like this.



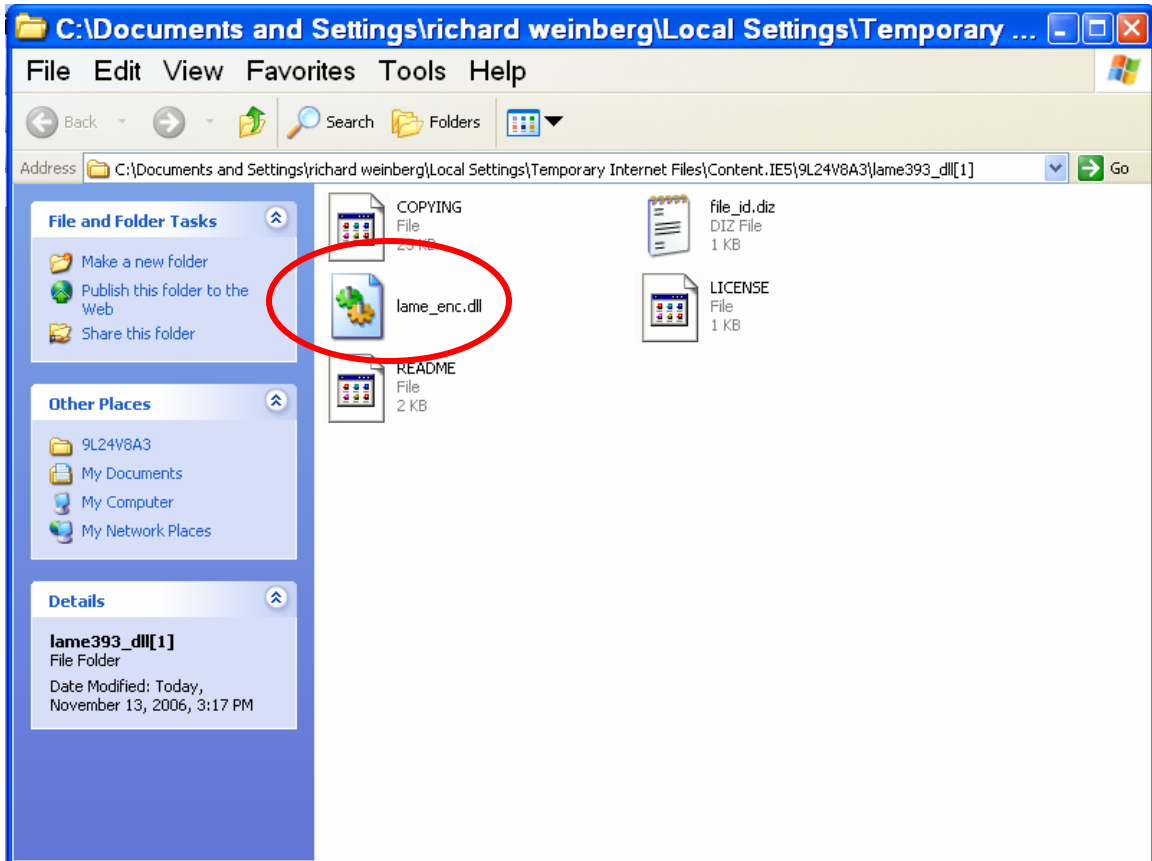
7) Click Open

8) Next you will get a box that looks like this



9) You will want to click "Extract all Files."

- 10) After you click “Extract all Files” the “Extraction Wizard” will open up. Just hit next a couple times and you will get a new window that looks like this.



- 11) What I like to do next is drag my Lame Encoder to the desktop.
- 12) Next, I need to tell audacity where to find my Lame Encoder.
You only have to do this once and Audacity finds it for you from now on.
- 13) Just make a test audio file in Audacity and on the file menu select “Export as MP3.” Then name the test file that you are exporting as an MP3 and click save.
- 14) Audacity will ask to locate the Lame Encoder at a message like this will appear.
